RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF CRAWFORD COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA APPROVING CRAWFORD COUNTY HOSPITAL AUTHORITY 2018 NOTE ISSUANCE

WHEREAS, the Crawford County Hospital Authority (the "Authority") was incorporated under the Municipality Authorities Act of 1945, approved May 12, 1945, P.L. 382, as amended (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, the Act specifies, *inter alia*, that the purpose of an authority shall be for "acquiring, holding, constructing, financing, improving, maintaining and operating, owning, leasing ... projects of the following kind and character ... hospitals, health centers" and to finance such projects "by making loans, which may be evidenced by, and secured as may be provided in, loan agreements"; and

WHEREAS, Meadville Medical Center ("MMC") is undertaking a project (the "Project") consisting of financing, through the issuance by the Authority of one or more series of its tax-exempt notes (the "2018 Notes") all or a portion of the costs of (a) various capital expenditures of the Borrower or its affiliates from the Borrower's fiscal year 2019 capital budget, and (b) paying the costs of issuance of the 2018 Notes; and

WHEREAS, all or a portion of the 2018 Notes are expected to be sold to Laurel Capital Corporation (the "Lender") pursuant to a financing or other agreement among the Authority, MMC and the Lender; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has determined that the Project will further the purposes of the Authority and is desirable for the health, safety, and welfare of the people in the area served by MMC and the Authority has determined to issue the 2018 Notes; and

WHEREAS, the Act provides that none of the powers granted thereby shall be exercised in the construction, improvement, maintenance, extension or operation of any project or projects which in whole or part shall duplicate or compete with existing enterprises serving substantially the same purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Act further provides that the foregoing limitations shall not apply to projects whereby MMC and other health center facilities serve the public, if the municipality or county organizing the Authority for such projects shall declare by resolution or ordinance that it is desirable for the health, safety and welfare of the people in the area served by MMC, or such other health care centers; and

WHEREAS, the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), requires that an issue or obligation be approved by the applicable elected representative of the governmental unit which contains the facility to be financed with the proceeds of an issue, after a public hearing following reasonable public notice; and

WHEREAS, a duly advertised public hearing was held by the Authority on July 23, 2018 at 890 Market Street, Meadville, PA 16335 with respect to the Project at which comments were sought and no comments were received; and

WHEREAS, the Authority adopted a resolution at the meeting of the Board of the Authority held on July 23, 2018, at which a quorum was present and acting throughout, authorizing the issuance of the 2018 Notes, which resolution has not been altered, amended, or repealed and is in full force and effect on the date of this Resolution, and no other resolutions relating to the transactions referred to in the Authority's resolution have been adopted by the Authority.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby resolved that:

- 1. It is desirable for the health, safety and welfare of the people in Crawford County and the area served by MMC for the Authority to participate in the Project and to provide financing for the Project through the issuance of the 2018 Notes.
- 2. Crawford County, in satisfaction of the public approval requirements of the Code, hereby approves the issuance of the 2018 Notes for the Project and the Chairman of the Board of Crawford County Commissioners is hereby designated the "applicable elected representative", as that term is defined and used in Section 147 of the Code, and is authorized to execute and deliver a certificate evidencing such approval.

WHEREAS, at a public meeting of the Board of the Authority convened and held on July 23, 2018, at which a quorum was present and acting throughout, the Authority adopted a Resolution authorizing the issuance of the 2018 Notes to finance costs of the Project, which Resolution has not been altered, amended or repealed and is in full force and effect on the date of this Certificate, and no other Resolutions relating to the transactions referred to in such Resolution have been adopted by the Authority; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Crawford County, Pennsylvania (the "Board of Commissioners") approved the issuance of the 2018 Notes for the Project in satisfaction of the public approval requirements of the Code at a duly advertised meeting of the Board of Commissioners held on July 25, 2018 at which a quorum was present and acting throughout; and

WHEREAS, the undersigned is the "applicable elected representative" within the meaning of Section 147 of the Code, having been designated as such by the Board of Commissioners;

NOW, THEREFORE, the undersigned applicable elected representative, in satisfaction of the public approval requirement of the Code, hereby approves the issuance of the 2018 Notes for the Project.

- 1. The proposed project of Rapid Rehousing through CHAPS to be funded by a grant from the Pennsylvania ESG Program meet the ESG interim rule requirements at §24 CFR 576 are eligible and approved.
- 2. The Crawford County Planning Office on behalf of the Crawford County Board of Commissioners is authorized and directed to execute an ESG Program application in the amount of \$116,751 to the PA Department of Community and Economic Development.
- 3. The Crawford County Planning Office will assume the responsibility for securing the required matching amount of project funds or request a waiver of match funds to DCED.
- 4. The Crawford County Commissioners will reimburse the commonwealth for any expenditure found to be ineligible.
- 5. The Crawford County Planning Office is authorized to provide such assurances, certificates, and supplemental data or revised data that DCED may request in connection with the application.
