**NOW THEREFORE**, **BE IT RESOLVED**, and it is hereby **RESOLVED**, by the County of Crawford, Pennsylvania, by its governing body, the duly elected and incumbent Board of County Commissioners, Francis F. Weiderspahn, Jr., John M. Amato, and John Christopher Soff, as follows:

- 1. That the surplus 9mm ammunition may forthwith be transferred to the City of Meadville Police Department to be used for such purposes as it deems most appropriate.
- 2. The appropriate County officials are hereby authorized and instructed to carry out the intent of this Resolution in cooperation with Meadville City Police Department staff, and to execute any and all documents necessary to implement this Resolution.
