February Regular Meeting Minutes Crawford County Public Safety Building, Meadville, Pennsylvania

Commissioner Dreese, Chair, called the Regular Meeting of the Crawford County Planning Commission (Planning Commission) to order at 3:30 p.m. on February 28, 2022.

2. Action on 2022 Reorganization Meeting Minutes:

Commissioner Dreese requested action on the 2022 Reorganization Meeting Minutes. Commissioner Frye moved to adopt the minutes; Commissioner Wickert seconded; during discussion Commissioner Hilburn noted that her name is spelled with only a single "l" motion carried unanimously.

3. Action on January 2022 Regular Meeting Minutes:

Commissioner Dreese requested action on the January 2022 Regular Meeting Minutes. Commissioner Wickert moved to adopt the minutes; Commissioner Hilburn seconded; motion carried unanimously.

4. Communications:

Mr. Norwood provided an update on the communications received by the Planning Commission since their January 2022 regular meeting. Communications included:

- PennDOT NW RPO (Rural Planning Organization) Project Updates;
- Planning Office communications to local municipalities instructing them that SALDO application review letters will no longer be sent directly to surveyors; and
- National Association of Counties Newsletter.

5. Reports:

A. Standing Committees -

<u>Transportation Committee</u>: In the absence of Commissioner Lawrence, Commissioner Frye and Mr. Norwood provided a report. Commissioner Frye has attempted to coordinate a meeting with electric vehicle charging providers with limited success. Mr. Norwood noted that CATA is working to secure accommodations and infrastructure for electric vehicles in Crawford County.

<u>Agricultural and Environmental Concerns Committee:</u> Commissioner Wickert reported on the committee's February 10th work session. The committee met with Mark Lewis and reduced the scope of the County Forest Strategic Plan. Another series of work sessions are planned in addition to the annual County Forest Day coming up on April 11, 2022. The committee's next work session will be on Tuesday, March 8th from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. at the County Courthouse. The subsequent work session will be held on April 1, 2022 from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.

Commissioner Lawrence entered the meeting at around 3:42 p.m.

Personnel: Commissioner Dreese noted that the committee has not met.

<u>Planning Initiatives Committee</u>: Commissioner Mattocks reported that the committee on February 16, 2022. The committee continued to advance its work on putting together a housing investment and revitalization program for Crawford County. The final draft of the proposal will be ready for the March 2022 Regular Meeting. The committee also worked on identifying other priorities for 2022. Mr. Norwood informed the Commission that Titusville has allocated funded under the 2021 CDBG (*Community Development Block Grant*) program to conduct a Church Run flooding study as well as select flood mitigation projects. Hydetown Borough has not expressed any interest in conducting similar efforts, however, that borough did express interest in other projects. Commissioner Mattock's further noted that the committee is discussing the development of a model ordinance resource for UCC compliant Airbnbs (*Short-Term Rentals*) as well as the possibility of a blighted property scoring system. Commissioner Wickert expressed the importance of building relationships to encourage communities to adopt short-term rental regulations. Commissioner Frye expressed that the resource would help those jurisdictions that are interested in regulating short-term rentals.

Community Development Projects

NTIA – BROADBAND ANNOUNCEMENT

• On Friday February 24, 2022 the National Telecommunications and Information Agency (NTIA) announced their grant awards for a broadband expansion program. Crawford County's application was not selected for funding.

BEAVER, RICHMOND, AND STEUBEN TOWNSHIP ARCHITECTURAL BARRIER REMOVAL PROJECTS

• Planning staff held a preconstruction meeting for the contractors selected to undertake the above-named construction project on Thursday February 23, 2022. The projects will be in construction this spring and summer, likely delayed due to difficulty obtaining materials. Staff is currently working on finalizing a schedule with the contractors to prepare an extension request to DCED.

AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT - COUNTY PRIORITIES

• Planning staff are working to develop two of the County's priority funding areas for ARPA resources. Under development is a series of request for proposals for last mile broadband deployment and wireless broadband deployment to underserved areas of Crawford County.

Additionally, staff are working to develop a revitalization program aimed at leveraging local funding to attract state, federal, and philanthropic resources for long-term improvements to our communities. This program will likely focus on four areas of interest: Planning, Redevelopment Initiatives, Neighborhood Stabilization, and Placemaking or quality of life projects. Details on the program should be announced this summer.

Legislative Updates

HOUSE BILL 221 - OPEN SPACE LAND MAINTENANCE

• Representative Rader from Monroe County has reintroduced legislation that will allow communities to better maintain municipal owned lands used for parks and recreation purposes for residents. Under this proposed legislation, municipalities will be able to use the 25% of funds currently earmarked for maintenance and development under the "open space tax," regardless of the method of acquisition or purchase of land serving an "open space benefit." This bill has passed the House and is currently in the Senate.]

 - a. Public involvement coordination for Ernst Trail study;

Mrs. Wickert provided an overview of the Ernst Trail feasibility study and discussed some options for how the committee could get involved to support the project. Currently, route options for connecting the existing trail into downtown Meadville are being explored.

b. East Crawford County flood mitigation work;

- 6. Checklist for next timber sale [11:40 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.]
 - a. standard contract updates (CCPO);

Mr. Gilbertson reported that updates to the insurance requirements, bid bonding, failure to perform after payment provisions of the timber sale contract are necessary for future sales. The revised contract will be incorporated as a reusable appendix within the County Forest Strategic Plan to support future timbering work.

b. timber sale prospectus;

Mr. Lewis will soon begin work on developing a new sales area prospectus for the upcoming timber sale. The committee will be given a tour of the site on April 11th and to collect comments that will help inform the next sale.

- c. estimate for removal of competing vegetation; Within the next sales area there are 21 acres that need to be treated for invasive species at around \$400 per acreage – herbicides and removal of beech (mid-May to mid-September). Additionally, a contract could also be created to manage invasive species in the wetlands (the wetlands are more of a priority than the beech – would cost between \$400 and \$1,000 total).
- d. location of timber landing site (could this play off the "strategic plan?"); To be determined this Spring – just one landing should be sufficient – logistics are difficult.



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e. how can County Forest Day comments help tee up the next timber sale in addition to other aims?

Committee members can contribute best by highlighting areas with erosion, wetlands, historical or cultural items that are present, and unique plant species that are present (rare or endangered).

April 1st Work-Session should focus solely on County Forest Day to maximize the effort.
